Synopsis

Act One

The kids think they rule in small town Rydell ("Grease Is The Word") They head back to school, their last year at Rydell High. Danny is a member of the ultra-cool Burger Palace Boys, only interested in cars, chicks and hanging out with his mates; Kenickie, Sonny, Roger, and Doody. Sandy; the new girl at school; doesn't fit in with the Pink Ladies: Rizzo, Jan, Marty, and Frenchy, although they are interested in her summer romance ('Summer Nights'). Sandy and Danny are unexpectedly reunited. She is thrilled to see him again but Danny isn't sure how hanging out with a 'good' girl will affect his image.

All the boys contemplate growing up ('Those Magic Changes') and what lies ahead.

The boys, meanwhile, meet up at the garage to see Kenickie's new car, he has been working all summer to buy it. The others think it is a heap of junk but Danny and Kenickie persuade them it will be a great way to attract the girls ('Greased Lightnin')!

After being rejected by the Pink Ladies, Sandy tries cheerleading ('Rydell Fight Song') but doesn't seem to fit in there either. She bumps into Danny again but things are awkward between them.

All the kids meet up on the football field, Roger and Jan get talking and, slowly, discover they like each other and have a lot in common ('Mooning'). A party atmosphere follows, as the kids celebrate their friendships ('We Go Together').

Act Two

t's time for the school dance, everyone is paired off and wearing their finest ('Shakin at the High School Hop'). Vince Fontaine is hosting the evening; much to Marty's delight. Only Sandy is missing out on all the fun; she is stuck at home with a head cold ('Its Raining on Prom Night'). Things hot up at the dance: a dance contest is announced and Danny pairs up with Cha-Cha, a top dancer. They go on to win the contest ('Born to Hand Jive') although Miss Lynch disapproves of some of their dance moves. All alone Sandy faces up to the fact that she still loves Danny ('Hopelessly Devoted to You'), however futile it may be.

Things aren't working out too well for Frenchy either. Having left high school to train as a beautician, she is finding that she may not be cut out for the job, but can't admit it to her friends ('Beauty School Dropout').

Sandy and Danny finally get together; he borrows Kenickie's car and takes her to the drive-in. Sandy is there to watch the movie but Danny has other things on his mind. Sandy is upset when he takes things too far and leaves him alone in the car, wondering if he'll ever get it right ('Sandy').

The gang all hang out at the garage listening to music ('Rock 'n' Roll Party Queen'). Sandy joins them in the hope that Danny will appear. Rizzo makes it clear that she still isn't welcome amongst them. Kenickie discovers that Rizzo may be pregnant and they have a row. Everyone hastily leaves, except Sandy, whose sympathy is rejected by Rizzo ('There Are Worse Things I Could Do'). Sandy realises if she wants things to be different then she needs to make some changes about herself ('Look At Me I'm Sandra Dee – Reprise').

All the kids at the burger bar are in for a big surprise; especially Danny; when a transformed Sandy arrives, looking hot and with an attitude to match ('You're The One That I Want'). Once again the mood is up, Rizzo's pregnancy was a false alarm; and all the kids celebrate being young and in love ('Finale').

David Sidwell: Director

Director...musical director...composer... orchestrator/arranger...pianist... David has 35 years' involvement in music and theatre under his belt. As Musical Director, some of David's

many credits include Godspell, Jesus Christ Superstar, Chicago, Evita, Annie, Holly Dolly!, Nunsense 1&II, Les Miserables, Juke Box, A Chorus Line, Gypsy, Caught in the Act (with Tina Cross), to name but a few.

David has also directed countless productions. Among them, Hair, A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum, Mack and Mabel, Best Little Whorehouse in Texas, Chess: The Musical, Big: The Musical, Jesus Christ Superstar, 70, Girls, 70, Les Miserables, Tell Me On A Sunday, Buddy: The Buddy Holly Story, The Scarlet Pimpernel, Fame, Seussical, Blood Brothers, Godspell, Little Shop of Horrors, and Crazy For You, along with the 'audience participation' version of The Sound of Music, a 'new experience' Grease, the sensational Hamilton seasons of The Rocky Horror Show and Cats.

Working professionally with theatre groups both in New Zealand and Australia, David has had successful seasons of Andrew Lloyd Webber & Friends (Gold Coast and New Zealand), Westend to Broadway with Wellington Musical Theatre and the Wellington Sinfonia, Tell Me On A Sunday (Circa Theatre), the critically acclaimed Wellington productions of West Side Story and Phantasmic, the New Zealand premiers of The Secret Garden, Big: The Musical, The Full Monty and Disney's High School Musical. 2009 is a busy year and sees him directing productions of Grease, Thoroughly Modern Millie and Disney's Beauty and the Beast.

David is an accomplished pianist and has worked with many New Zealand recording artists. He has been the pianist for the New Zealand Film Archive touring roadshows, and works extensively throughout New Zealand and Australia as an arranger and orchestrator. He also lectures in music and manages the Music Department of the School of Media Arts at Wintec.



Campbell Douglas: Musical Director

Campbell graduated from The University of Auckland in 1995 with a Bachelor of Music in composition and conducting.

During the time he conducted the Auckland Youth Orchestra, the Auckland University Singers and his own choir, The O'Rourke Singers. He was also accompanist for L'Academic de Danse.

Campbell is currently a Deputy Principal at Hamilton's Fraser High School where he has been the Musical Director for their successful productions of Jesus Christ Superstar, Footloose, Joseph, the New Zealand premiere of Disney's High School Musical, and last year's Little Shop of Horrors. It has been a great pleasure for Campbell to see the progression of some of the talent from these shows progress into cast members for the Hamilton Operatic Society, most recently with Cats and the upcoming Beauty and the Beast.

Campbell has also been involved with the Hamilton Operatic Society for the last 12 years. He appeared on stage in HAIR, was a backing vocalist for A Chorus Line and keyboard player for Gypsy. After moving to Auckland, Campbell became involved with Centrestage Theatre in Orewa where he was Musical Director for The Wizard of Oz and Scrooge, and keyboard player for Jesus Christ Superstar. More recently, Campbell has been involved as a keyboard player for the Society's production of Les Miserables and Buddy: The Buddy Holly Story, as Assistant Musical Director for West End to Broadway and Musical Director for the New Zealand premiere of The Full Monty and HAIR. Campbell also had the privilege of being Musical Director for the Society's hugely successful productions of The Rocky Horror Show, Blood Brothers and last year's season of Cats.



Sonja McGirr-Garrett: Choreographer

Sonja originally came from Canada where she began her career at a very young age

She first discovered the pleasure of performance and team

achievement as a member of the Canadian Gymnastics team, competing around the globe on behalf of her country. The decision to follow her dreams in pursuit of a career in musical theatre came at the age of 12 when she captured her first leading role of Anne in Anne of Green Gables. She continued her studies gaining honours in a three-year diploma in musical theatre and dance and has since enjoyed success in many styles of shows ranging from Broadway to Vegas. Some of Sonja's favourites include 42nd Street, Dames at Sea, A Chorus Line, Grease, Pyjama Game, Winslow Boy, Bells are Ringing and Cats, where she was in the original Canadian company has recently completed the 20th anniversary gala performance tour.
