

**Date:** Monday 27<sup>th</sup> - Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> September 2010 **Venue:** Waikato Institute of Technology: Hamilton

**Concept:** shar-E-fest is designed to be a forum where those engaged in e-activities - for example, delivering e-learning events, developing online learning resources/services, providing access to digital materials, creating virtual spaces, and improving the digital literacy of participants - can share their innovations and experiences.

Costs: Registration for *shar-E-fest* will open in July 2010 and the registration fee has been set at \$175 + GST.

**Programme:** The programme has been designed around two keynote presentations (Peter Looms from Denmark a confirmed keynote), five "hands-on" workshops/tutorials of 100 minutes (a computer room with 30 computers is available), thirty interactive sessions (demonstrations, round-tables, case studies and brief presentations) of 30 minutes and interactive posters.

**Call for Submissions:** The first call for submissions will be made on June 1 and submissions will close on July 30. Submissions can be made online through the Moodle Site (Click Here).

(NB: you will be prompted to create an account on Moodle. Once registered, click on the shar-E-fest 2010 link at top right hand side of the page, under 'My Courses')

**Peer Review Process**: All submissions will be peer-reviewed by two members of the organising committee using a concept of "rolling acceptance". What does this mean?

- 1. When an author submits a presentation the peer review panel member receives an email notification and can immediately begin the review process.
- 2. If necessary peer reviewers can make "suggestions" to the authors of a submission for any changes.
- 3. Authors can be notified quickly of the status of their proposal.

## What are the benefits?

- 1. No "backlog" of presentations to be reviewed on a set date
- 2. Peer reviewers have a more positive role as "mentors" and/or facilitators
- 3. Accepted authors have more time to make arrangements to attend shar-E-fest.
- 4. Potential participants can review the potential "flavour" of the event
