They're all among the cockeyed characters in James Lapine and Stephen Sondheim's

fractured fairy tale.

When a Baker and his Wife learn they've been cursed with childlessness by the Witch next door, they embark on a quest for the special objects (a cow as white as milk...a cape as red as blood... hair as yellow as corn... a slipper as pure as gold...) required to break the spell, swindling, lying to and stealing from Cinderella (with the slipper as pure as gold), Little Red Riding Hood (with a cape as red as blood), Rapunzel (with the hair as yellow as corn) and Jack (the one who climbed the beanstalk - with the cow as white as milk).

Everyone's wish is granted at the end of Act
One but the consequences of their actions
return to haunt them later,
with disastrous results.

A Giant (a female Giant, that is) steps down from the heavens and straight upon some beloved characters. It takes a few lives before the survivors realize that they have to act all together in order to succeed. Thus, what begins a lively irreverent fantasy becomes a moving lesson about community responsibility and the stories we tell our children.

Victoria is Director of Music & Performing Arts at St Peter's School.

Into The Woods is Victoria's twelfth production at St Peter's School – the eleventh for her as a musical director here. Victoria has been consistently impressed with the enthusiasm, discipline and dedication of all of those involved in the annual school productions, from those on stage, to the orchestra, to the hard-working crew found behind the scenes.

After beginning her musical career as a 7 year old classical violinist in Hamilton, Victoria's love of musical theatre began and has grown from a role in Hamilton Operatic Society's Man Of Steel 22 years ago, to Musical Director for some of Hamilton Operatic Society's most successful productions, including Hairspray!, Joseph and The Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat, Oliver! featuring Richard O'Brien, and EVITA.

Victoria's violin playing roots have also seen her play in various acoustic music circles, including a long stint as the fiddle player for Hamilton Irish band Reelmen. In more recent times Victoria has had the immense pleasure of taking up a spot as the fiddle player with the Hamilton County Bluegrass Band, and this has seen her perform as part of the Dame Malvina Major Diamond Jubilee Tour in 2014, and the NZ Gold Guitar Awards in 2015.

Into The Woods is a unique show. The score is true to Stephen Sondheim's characteristic style, with every lyric being carefully crafted to support the well-known fairy tales which are woven together to create an intricate and thought-provoking plot. Sondheim is indeed a master! Our students have worked hard to become proficient in delivering his unique melodic and lyric writing, and their ensemble singing is a highlight of this show.
