Information:

During WW2, thousands of American servicemen were sent to New Zealand to form a military base for the Allies' counter-offensive against the Japanese. The US Military erected five radio towers on the Te Atatu Peninsula around 1942, which served as radio location beacons for the navigation of overseas flights.

Gareth Williams has been making sculpture since the mid-1980's and holds a Masters in Fine Art degree from RMIT, Melbourne. Gareth has recently had exhibitions at the Te Whare Taonga O

Waikato (Waikato Museum), Hamilton and Te Manawa, Palmerston North and he currently teaches in the School of Media Arts at the Waikato Institute of Technology.
