This seminar focuses on methodological and ethical challenges that researchers face when they conduct research with babies, toddlers and young children in early childhood and primary school settings.

It is grounded in an understanding that children are social actors, "beings not becoming", with rights and agency, and a voice to be listened to. Children's voice in research is crucial, not only in relation to their views on topics that affect them, but also in relation to whether the research undertaken meets ethical principles, particularly of informed consent (or assent), confidentiality, and protection from harm. Using examples from their own research, the four panellists will discuss ways in which they have approached researching with young children,

challenges and highlights, and ethical issues they have navigated. The seminar will be interactive, with panellists offering stimulation for audience discussion, not offering solutions but pointing some directions.
